Undergraduate Faculty Qualifications and Tested Experience

The University of Southern Indiana (USI) recognizes and adheres to the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) guidelines for determining qualified faculty through Accreditation and Assumed Practices (B.2). USI employs competent faculty who are qualified to accomplish the mission and goals of the University. When determining acceptable qualifications of its faculty, including dual credit instructors, the University gives primary consideration to the highest earned degree in the discipline. This policy recognizes that in some instances, there may be a generally accepted standard with regard to some disciplines some instances, there may be a generally accepted standard with regard to some disciplines a sub-field.

Assumed Practice B.2 allows an institution to determine that a faculty member is qualified based on tested experience outside of the classroom in real-world situations relevant to the discipline in which the faculty member would be teaching. As a result, the University may consider, as appropriate: competence; effectiveness; related work
