Because *Vintage Times* could not hold every response about your activities during the pandemic, this addendum includes the balance.

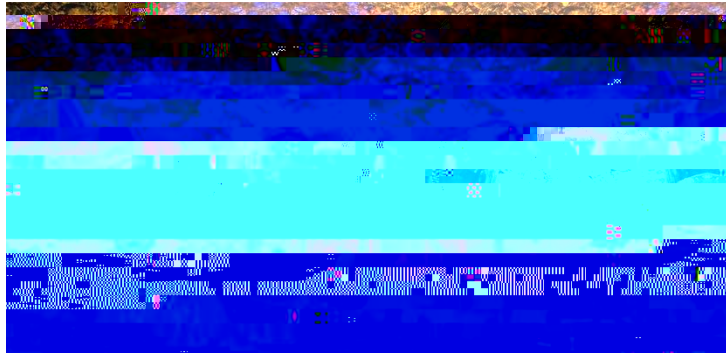
A note about my at-home escapades:
